Quick Writes followed by sharing sessions are a common practice at the school. Students engage with short prompts to write about, encouraging them to express their ideas succinctly and then share their thoughts with peers. This strategy develops writing, communication, and listening skills.

The **Think, Pair, Share** method is employed regularly, encouraging students to reflect individually before discussing their thoughts with a partner and then sharing with the whole class. This technique provides students multiple opportunities to process information and articulate their understanding.

Using **non-verbal cues** such as Thumbs Up/Down/Sideways and Whiteboard Responses for formative assessment allows teachers to gauge student understanding instantly. This approach provides valuable feedback, enabling instructors to adjust their teaching strategies in real-time to address any misconceptions.

Implementing **Notices and Wonders** encourages students to observe, question, and analyze information. This technique promotes curiosity and critical thinking skills by inviting students to inquire and explore various aspects of the topic.

Exit Tickets followed by sharing sessions are helpful for both students and teachers. Students summarize their learning or pose questions before leaving the classroom, allowing instructors to assess comprehension and address any lingering doubts or confusion.

Choral Responses, where the entire class responds together in unison, foster a sense of community, and ensure active participation from every student.
